Impact Assessment of PEF, IGA & Processing unit schemes in OPELIP areas

1. The SC&ST Department, Govt of Odisha has financing towards the cost of *OPELIP* (“the client” or “procuring entity”), and intends to apply part of the proceeds for the recruitment of consulting services to undertake research/evaluation studies on selected areas/subjects, for which this RFP is issued.
2. The client now invites Request for Proposal (RFP) from legally constituted consulting firms (not individual consultants) to conduct an Impact study on PVTG Empowerment Funds (PEF), Income Generating Activities (IGA) and Processing Units *in OPELIP areas*. A detailed requirement on these consulting services is provided in the terms of reference (TOR) which may be seen in the website of OPELIP. The legally constituted consulting firm is required to submit the following documents:
 - I. Proof of registration and existence & provide a self-attested copy of registration, GST certificate and self-attested copy of PAN card.
 - II. Should not have been blacklisted by Central/State Govt./Govt. agencies and provide a self-declaration by the authorized representative (self-declaration to this effect)
 - III. The audited financial statements for the period 2020/21, 2021/22 & 2022-23.
 - IV. The agency must have Annual Average Turnover of Rs. 5 Lakhs for last 3 years as on 31.03.2023 (Audited certificate must be attached).
 - V. The agency must have field experience and documentation in ST/PVTG areas. Earlier documentation on PVTG will be added advantages for the agency.
 - VI. Minimum three (3) years of experience in conducting survey, documentation, impact assessment etc. with special focus in PVTG areas.

Procedure: the selection process will be conducted using QCBS. The agency will submit detailed technical and financial proposal in two separate covers superscribing *Financial and technical in respective covers and putting these two covers in another cover which will contain both the proposals (Technical & Financial)* as per requirement. The evaluation will include a review and verification of qualifications and past performance, including a reference check, prior to the award of the contract.

Submission Procedure: Interested eligible organizations may submit RFP using the template provided for this purpose (in the TOR) through Register post/ speed post/general post/courier. Your RFP should comprise one (1) original copy along with all required documents. RFP shall be submitted to the address below no later than **16th August 2023 at IST 3:30PM**.

Terms of Reference (ToR) for conducting impact assessment of PVTG Empowerment Funds, Income Generating Activities & Processing Units in achieving developmental outcomes under Odisha PVTG Empowerment & Livelihoods Improvement Programme (OPELIP)

1.1. Background

Government of Odisha in partnership with International Fund for Agriculture Development (IFAD) has taken up Odisha PVTG Empowerment & Livelihoods Improvement Programme (OPELIP) meant for livelihoods Improvement of 13 Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups in the State. The goal is to improve their living condition and reduction of poverty.

The programme is being implemented through 17 Micro Project Agencies in 12 districts, 89 Gram Panchayats covering 1125 habitations (Hamlets/villages). The programme targets to cover 96651 households during 8 years programme period. The key objectives of the programme are: Food & nutrition security, ensuring livelihoods opportunities, capacity building of PVTGs, entitlements over land & forest, improved agriculture practices for increase in production, establishment of micro enterprises as alternative source of livelihoods and ensuring community infrastructure.

OPELIP interventions are implemented in 17 Micro-Project Agency (MPA) areas located in twelve districts of Odisha namely Malkanagiri, Rayagada, Angul, Deogarh, Ganjam, Nuapada, Keonjhar, Sundergarh, Gajapati, Kandhamal, Kalahandi and Mayurbhanj. The programme directly covers 96651 households comprising PVTGs, ST, SC and Others in the programme villages directly.

1.2. Goal and Objectives of OPELIP

The overall goal of OPELIP is to achieve ‘enhanced living conditions and reduced poverty of the target group households. This is sought to be achieved through realizing the development objective of enabling improved livelihoods and food & nutrition security primarily for 27308 PVTG households, 39969 other tribal households and 29374 other poor and Schedules Caste (SC) households. This in turn will be achieved via building the capacity of the target households, securing them their entitlements over land and forest, improving their agricultural practices for enhanced production, promoting income-generating micro-enterprises for alternate livelihoods and ensuring access to education, health and other services and improving community infrastructure.

Programme Components: The OPELIP has four major components, namely

- (i) Community empowerment,
- (ii) Natural Resource Management (NRM) and livelihoods enhancement;
- (iii) Community infrastructure and drudgery reduction and
- (iv) Programme Management.

2.1. Purpose and Scope of the study

Programme gives support under PVTG Empowerment Funds (PEF) is placed with GPLF promoted jointly by OPELIP & OLM. This is basically meant for providing easy access to the PVTG in particular and ST and mixed SHG in general lent with minimal interest rate. This helps in turn easy access to finance and take up different livelihood’s activities.

Secondly, Income generating Activities (IGA), the purpose of the activities is to ensure income security and access to fair markets for the PVTGs by expanding income generating opportunities and developing marketing collectives. The objective is to enhance the knowledge and skills of PVTG households with regard to traditional home based income generating activities, expand the scale and scope of these activities, create sustainable service and support systems for these activities, enhance the value of the

NTFPs collected by the PVTGs, establish viable collectives to realize fair prices for NTFPs and create opportunities for employment in the rural/urban industrial economy. To supplement additional regular incremental income of the vulnerable households (poorest the poor/ differently able/ women headed household/ old person/land less/prabashi without family support) as identified by the VDA.

Income generating activities (IGA) are supported among the poorest of the poor households, such as the landless, women headed households, persons engaged in traditional artisanal activities and the physically challenged, identified in the VDA. The activities are chosen by the beneficiaries based on their traditional skill and/or context and assessment of potential and included rope making, grocery store, black smithy, carpentry, bamboo craft, local vending, repair shops, milling of millets, tribal art and painting, etc. Income Generating Activities (IGAs) consist of small businesses managed by an individual (Male/Female) to increase their household income through livelihood diversification.

Thirdly, Processing unit supported to SHG in terms of service mode and drudgery reduction purposes. rice hauler, puffed rice, brick making unit, tent house etc. are some of the activities taken up by the SHG as a whole. Few activities helps them to reduce drudgery and few activities taken up as business mode.

The study focus will be how these activities impacted in terms of creating livelihoods or additional income sources to the SHG, family and reducing drudgery too. It also will look at the process being followed at various level from selecting the beneficiaries to roll out of the activities. each process need to be documented so that it will help to redesign if any suggestions come out.

The study would review Schematic guidelines, process and programme interventions made by OPELIP prior to preparation of evaluation design and tools. It would try to assess impact on income and standard of living of beneficiary households and women SHGs. The study would assess efficiency and effectiveness of interventions under livelihood schemes and other infrastructure activities. Besides, it would try to understand the changes that it has brought about in income enhancement, poverty reduction, and quality of life of beneficiary households directly and community indirectly. Socio-economic conditions of target beneficiaries will be studied through door-to-door household survey. Their perception with regard to the different PEF, IGA & Processing unit schemes and benefits will be explored during impact assessment survey. The perception of community at village level will be recorded during Focus Group Discussion (FGD). Gaps and suggestions will be explored from Key stakeholders including GPLF/BMMU/MPA/ FNGO/ Block Level /district officials, CRPs etc. For the purpose, a sample of 9 Micro Project Agencies (MPAs) will be covered. Accordingly, sample Gram Panchayats, villages and target beneficiaries will be drawn on random basis.

2.3. Study Objectives

The **overall objective** of the study is to assess the process documentation and impact of PEF, IGA & Processing unit programme on the economy, livelihood and quality of life of PVTG people covered under OPELIP.

Specific objectives of the study are as follows:

- a. To make a comprehensive study of the PEF, IGA & Processing unit programme interventions starting from selection of beneficiaries, planning, phases of implementation, forward and backward linkages and identify the gaps, scope for sustainability of programme implementations
- b. To study the impact of PEF, IGA & Processing unit on the livelihood, economy, drudgery reduction and quality of life of PVTG households.
- c. To examine the appropriateness of the PEF, IGA & Processing unit programme interventions taken up under OPELIP for addressing the livelihoods and empowerment needs of the target beneficiaries.

- d. To understand the gaps in programme design, planning and identify the schemes bottlenecks/challenges, if any,
- e. this document will be much helpful for other line dept. and other state govt. to follow for such coordination and convergence with OLM & Dept. of Mission Shakti.

2.4. Approach and methodology

Study Design

The study will adopt observational study design to capture relevant data from the PVTG beneficiary households covered under OPELIP to understand the relevance and usefulness of PEF, IGA & Processing unit activities taken up under OPELIP for the development and economic empowerment of the people. The study will be exploratory and empirical in nature with a mixed method approach. Both qualitative and quantitative techniques will be used with regard to data collection and analysis. The participatory approach will be adopted during the course of the study to understand the impact of PEF, IGA & Processing unit schemes taken up under OPELIP at the household and group/ community level.

2.5. Key Research Questions

- a. Has OPELIP PEF, IGA & Processing unit /programs planned/ designed / implemented as per the local needs in terms of skills, capacities, resources, challenges, etc?
- b. Has there been any improvement in household economy and quality of life?
- c. How PEF, IGA & Processing unit approaches have been conceptualized and implemented for the PVTG beneficiary households?
- d. Any change observed at the household level with respect to livelihood opportunities and income?
- e. What are the indications of sustainability and replicability?

2.6. Review of Literature

Available literature such as OPELIP intervention plan, project specific documents, monitoring and progress reports, to be reviewed to understand the status of the PEF, IGA & Processing unit scheme/programme interventions and the logic behind. During the study process, secondary information shall be collected from FNGO, MPA, OPELIP and different line dept. and will be reviewed to understand various initiatives taken by OPELIP that are incidental to improvement of livelihood and economy of covered beneficiaries through PEF, IGA & Processing unit schemes/programs interventions.

2.7. Study Universe and Sampling:

- a. The universe of the study is limited to sample 9 MPAs (to be selected in consultation with OPELIP State office). Purposive sampling method will be followed for selection of MPAs to make the geography and the interventions representative of the OPELIP. The MPAs will be selected in such a way that the chance of each community / sub-community will be there. Therefore 9 MPAs i.e. LDA, Mayurbhanj, JDA Keonjhar, PBDA Angul, KKDA Lanjigarh, DKDA Chatikona (Rayagada), BDA & DDA Malkanagiri, LSDA Gajapati, TDA Ganjam. Maximum tribes are covered through this sampling.
- b. In the select study area, 81 villages will be drawn through simple random and multistage sampling (3 villages per Gram Panchayat, 3 GPs from each MPA) to assess the impact of PEF, IGA & Processing unit schemes and its outcome. The study will cover at least 3 IGA beneficiary in each villages. Hence a total of 243-250 HHs under IGA study purview 3

SHG in each villages under PEF (2 SHG) & Processing unit(1SHG). Hence total of 243 SHG will be studied for survey.

- c. 1 FGD will be the units of study in each village to know more about the process documentation.
- d. Line Dept., Govt. of Odisha to be the unit of study purview (OLM).

2.8. Indicators of Assessment:

- a. Income enhancement of the beneficiaries through PEF, IGA & Processing unit schemes/programs prior to OPELIP intervention and during OPELIP phase
- b. Drudgery reduction and improvement in quality of life of the individual and community.
- c. Improvement in farm productions, other income sectors towards resilient household economy
- d. Social and economic wellbeing of the households supported under OPELIP.

2.9. Study Methodology Tools / Instruments:

As the study is based on both primarily and secondary sources of data, a detail data collection framework / checklist will be developed to capture required data / information from different sources. Structured schedules will be designed to collect information from different sources / stakeholders. The study instruments that are designed and will be administered are as follows.

- a. Structured Schedule for Household Interview (PEF, IGA & Processing unit scheme wise different schedules);
- b. Semi-Structured Format for Focus Group Discussions (FGD);
- c. Key informant interview (KII)
- d. Structured Checklist for Secondary Information;
- e. Case studies
- f. Discussion with the GPLF/BMMU, OLM/MPA/FNGO/District level schematic officers
- g. Discussion with OLM, at state level

NB. The agency will be developing all the tools mentioned above.

Focus group Discussions and Key Informant Interviews will be done at the village level to understand the impact of the PEF, IGA & Processing unit schemes/programs interventions on the lives and livelihoods of the OPELIP beneficiary households, and examine the appropriateness of the interventions taken up towards addressing problems of the target households. Besides, stakeholder meetings and personal interviews of the key functionaries of FNGO/ MPA of each of the sample MPAs will be done.
