

## **CASE STUDY ON GROCERY SHOP**

VDC: Dhenkasindhiba OPELIP Unnayana Sangha

Name of the Beneficiary: Sunita Sabara

### **Introduction:**

Sunita Sabara is the only daughter of her parents of Dimiripankala village under Badasindhaba VDC. Unfortunately, she is suffering from Polio and unable to stand without any support. Her father is a daily wage labourer and her mother works as a mini Anganwadi worker. She has a younger brother. So Dhenkasindhaba VDC decided to give some support to Sunita and make herself stop feeling disabled.

### **Intervention:**

So looking to the matter, Sunita was selected by the VDC for a grocery shop under IGA for the year 2018-19. In the beginning, she denied, but after counselling by our staff and the VDC, she finally understood that she can do it and she can be a support to her father. So in the month of December, she was given a grant of Rs.30,000/- to start a grocery shop. First, she used Rs.4,500/- to make herself and room for the shop, and out of the rest of the money, she bought a weighing machine and grocery items like dal, sugar, cooking oil, snacks, potatoes, etc. as per local need. She was given a normal price chart of all the items and instructed to sell accordingly.



### **Output:**

Gradually, she managed to run the shop, and today she is earning about Rs.2500 to Rs.3000 per month.

### **Outcome:**

Today, she is happy along with her parents. She says previously she was depending upon her father, but today she has overcome her disability and is capable to earn by herself, and she is no less than any normal-abled person.

### **Impact:**

As we know, OPELIP aims at a wholesome development of the community in the creed of gender. Besides bringing equity between the male and female, society also has a difference between the able and disabled. She is now an example for others.
